

A one-minute guide to Linked Social Workers

As part of Wakefield Families Together every school will have a Linked Social Worker.

This is to enable effective partnership working, a joined-up approach with education colleagues, and ensure that the right children receive the right help and protection, at the right time.

What will a Linked Social Worker do?

- Provide a point of contact, for example, to clarify if a case is open/closed to social care, or to assist if there have been difficulties in contacting the allocated social worker.
- Offer advice, guidance, and support for schools. This
 can include anonymised case discussions if there is
 uncertainty as to whether a case should be referred
 to social care, or if the Team Around the School (TAS)
 approach should be taken.
