

Physical Development

Make animal masks and decorate
Swing like monkeys out on the climbing frame/fitness trail
Making binoculars and cameras to take to the jungle
Add a flappy ear using a hinge to an elephant
Make a crocodile puppet

Mathematics

Look at patterns on animals then make a repeating pattern on a snake shape
Make animals using shapes
Painting spots of giraffes, how many spots do you have altogether?
Using language to compare size, e.g. big, bigger and biggest
Counting and number recognition to label sets of jungle animals

Literacy

Reading

Reading a range of jungle books such as 'Rumble in the Jungle' and 'Giraffe's Can't Dance'
Reading simple CVC words and matching them to the correct picture

Writing

Drawing our favourite jungle animals, can you write the initial sound?
Draw a giraffe, can you label its body parts?
Write a list of jungle animal

PSED

Look at dangerous animals and talk about why they are dangerous?
Look at videos of deforestation - link to looking after animal's homes, how would you feel?
Elmer story - proud to be different, how are you unique?



Communication and Language

Read 'Rumble in the Jungle' and discuss favourite animal explaining reasons
Make animal sounds to match to animal
Look at and describe elephants before comparing African and Asian elephants
To learn a jungle action poem
Small world jungle, encouraging children to act out stories

Expressive Arts and Design

Contribute to Elmer display - making different patch elephants
Painting jungle animals
Role playing Jungle safari
Using instruments to make loud and quiet sounds like jungle animals
Using different materials to make a safari jeep and moving animals

Understanding the World

What do animals eat?
Where do they live? Look at different parts of the jungle and a world map/globe
Pack clothing in suitcases - have a mix of warm weather so children have to choose appropriate clothing for a safari
Read non-fiction books to find out facts about jungle animals
